A single story structure of rectangular form. The large squared stucco columns one at each end of the porch, supports the low gable end of the roof. Verticle board strips fill the gable above a plain band of stucco. The low wall, exposed beams, multiple low gables and sectioned windows make this a classic example of this style. Sculptured bushes and mature trees enhance the property.
