This very low-gabled bungalow has exposed rafters and stucco walls and appears to be sideways version of a combination of craftsman styles. The veranda porch has elephantine columns which rest on bases of cobblestone and shades a pair of front windows decorated with rows of small panes located on top of the larger glass panes.

The architectural design and construction style of this house is of interest. The cobblestone bases of the porch columns and the unusual treatment of the front windows add a distinctive touch to the house's features. Built in the 1920's, it is smaller than the earlier craftsman style homes in the area, although it adheres to the same architectural styling.
