## Details

On 1/27/10, approximately 0115 hours, Gilroy Police Department received a report of two males on the reporting party's front porch dressed in black clothing and wearing gloves in the 900 block of Monticelli Court. The two males fled the area with the arrival of the reporting party.

Gilroy Police Officers responded to the area and located two persons matching the description on Padova Drive. The two subjects, later identified as Christopher Jacobs and Henry Loyd, recognized the Officer's presence and fled into side yards near by. Gilroy Police Officers conducted a search and located Jacobs and Loyd hiding within bushes. They were detained and subsequently arrested.

Four burglarized vehicles were located in the area as well as two vehicles which were tampered with. Property found in possession of the suspects was returned to the victims.

Christopher Jacobs and Henry Loyd were booked into the Santa Clara County jail on multiple felony charges.

Over the past several months there has been an increase in auto burglaries within the City of Gilroy. The Gilroy Police Department would like to remind everyone to remove items of value from their vehicles, make sure windows are closed and lock the vehicle doors. Please remain aware of your surroundings and report any suspicious activity to Law Enforcement.
