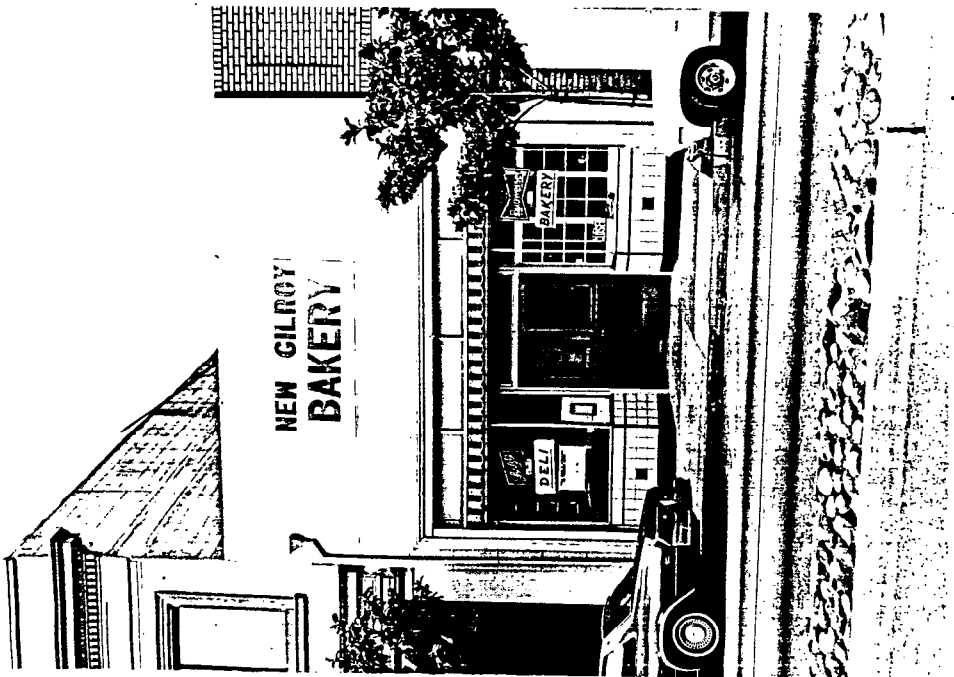

DESCRIPTION

 7b. Briefly describe the present *physical appearance* of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

This single story rectangular shaped simple commercial design exemplifies much of the old central business district of Gilroy. As an individual site, it has very little to distinguish it. The relatively unaltered wooden double door entry with transom window above surrounded by slightly angled large plate glass windows over simple tiles provide all the distinctiveness. However, again, the scale, orientation to the street, roofline and minimal detail help define the street. The urban design of downtown consists of 7 or 8 distinctive buildings lining Monterey Street designed in either a Mission Revival, Spanish Colonial Revival, Neo-classical, or Commercial style with smaller adjoining structures constructed in stripped down versions of the major buildings. The sum however is greater than its individual parts. Without structures such as 7373 Monterey Street, downtown Gilroy would suffer irreparable damage to its distinctiveness and would be a much less distinguished community architecturally.
