This simple bungalow is rectangular in plan, one story in height, and has an overhanging porch across half the facade. A three-part window with typical bungalow divided sections, the top of the center eight and on each side, is the focal point. Brackets attach the roof and exterior which is sheathed in narrow clapboard. The roof is asphalt shingle.
