This large, uniquely designed stucco bungalow has a second story in the rear half of the house and uses the roof of the front part for a second story porch, complete with trellised roof and wood railing. The enclosed eaves give the house a classic touch but the large veranda porch with hefty elephantine columns label it very California bungalow. The structure is designed on a basic rectangular plan, fenestration is varied. An aluminum screen door has been added to the structure. In the typical residential Gilroy form, the landscape is luxuriant, mature and well-tended.

**SIGNIFICANCE**
