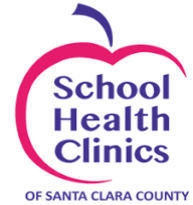

# Housing Transition Navigation

## What is it?

Help with finding and getting housing, including housing assessment and plan, housing search, help with housing applications. Resource search assistance etc.

## Who is eligible?

Homeless / at risk of homelessness **AND** at least one of the following:

- One or more serious chronic condition
- Serious Mental Illness (SMI) / Substance Use Disorder (SUD)
- At risk of institutionalization
- Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED) (children / adolescents)
- Exiting incarceration, OR
- Transitional-aged youth with significant barriers to housing

# Housing Tenancy and Sustaining Services

## What is it?

Help with keeping housing, including help with managing money and good tenant behaviors. Tenant education and advocacy.

## Who is eligible?

Homeless / at risk of homelessness **AND** at least one of the following:

- One or more serious chronic condition
- Serious Mental Illness (SMI) / Substance Use Disorder (SUD)
- At risk of institutionalization
- Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED) (children / adolescents)
- Exiting incarceration, OR
- Transitional-aged youth with significant barriers to housing

# Housing Navigation Success Story

## **8 year old girl with single dad, homeless for many years**

- Enrolled in Housing Navigation
- Living in their car, frequent visits to Urgent Care for seizures
- Many years of being on the Section 8 waitlist and being unsuccessful
- Helped connect them to Amigos de Guadalupe
- Received motel voucher from Amigos de Guadalupe
- Conducted weekly check-ins with the Santa Clara County Housing Authority (responsible for awarding section 8 vouchers)
- Once awarded, conducted tours with apartment complexes and assisted father in filling out numerous housing applications
- After 2 months, father's housing application was accepted
- Made referral to the Housing Deposits Program (\$3,700)
- Assisted father in moving in (applying to low-income programs: PG&E, WiFi)



# Medi-Cal Enrollment Program

**SHC has enrollment specialists for Medi-Cal application.**

**The enrollment specialists use the Covered California portal**

## **Documents Needed:**

Valid ID - can be a passport or CA ID

Proof of Address—something with the patient's name and the address. It could be a PG&E bill, Bank statement, etc.

Proof of Income—If they are working, how are they getting paid? (Cash/Paystub).

NOTE: last two recent pay stubs. If they get cash payment, they have to fill out the attestation form given by the Covered CA website to upload with their application.

# New Medi-Cal Changes

- For most Medi-Cal members, eligibility and benefits stay the same. However, there are some changes that may affect some people.
- **January 2026:** Medi-Cal once again consider assets (what you own) when reviewing eligibility for older adults and people with disabilities as part of the application and renewal process.
- **January 2026:** Medi-Cal freeze new enrollments for certain adults who are undocumented and do not have a satisfactory immigration status. This group no longer be able to newly enroll in full scope Medi-Cal.
